WALLISVILLE - Justice Ken Wise will speak about the Anahuac Disturbance at the Chambers County Museum at Wallisville, Wed., Nov. 19, from 6-7 p.m. This is the third and final event in the "History & Then Some" fall lecture series, exploring Chambers County history as it relates to Texas history.

Justice Wise sits on the

14th Court of Appeals in Houston. He is an adjunct professor at Houston Baptist University and a former adjunct professor at the University of Houston Law Center. He is the creator and host of the award-winning Texas history podcast Wise About Texas. Having published numerous journal articles, Justice Wise is a regular speaker on Texas history across the State of Texas. In 2021 he was honored by the Texas House of Representatives for his contributions in preserving Texas history. He will take us back in time to the turbulent events that began in Anahuac and set in motion the struggle for
