### Lafitte expert to speak at History & Then Some, Thursday

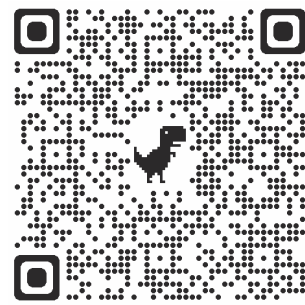
