Judge Prater served Liberty County for many years as a DPS trooper, postmaster, City of Dayton Judge, and Justice of the Peace. Most notably, he was a long-time scoutmaster who helped many young men reach their Eagle Scout award. Vivian Prater supported all of the family's scouting activities and was an active member of

the Aggie Moms.

The Prater Memorial Scholarship has historically awarded a \$1,000 scholarship to deserving students. The recipient of the Prater Memorial scholarship must be an Eagle Scout from Liberty County or from one of the 32 counties served by ETCF accepted to or currently enrolled at Texas A&M University.

Writing competition for grades 4-12

AUSTIN, TX - The Texas Center for the Book has announced the Letters About Literature Texas writing contest "Read. Be Inspired. Write Back." Texas 4th through 12th graders are invited to participate in this annual writing competition.

Students select a book, book series, essay, play, poem, short story or speech and write a letter to an author, living or dead, explaining how his or her work changed their view of themselves or the world. They may write about challenging events in their lives that relate to a book they have read. The possibilities are limitless.

There are three categories of competition:

grades 4-6, grades 7-8 and grades 9-12. The contest is open to all Texas students, including public, private and home school.

First-place winners receive \$300. Second-place winners receive \$200, and third-place winners receive \$100. Winning students will be recognized and receive their awards at the Texas Library Association Annual Conference in Houston, in

March 2026.

The online submission portal ([xtexasstatelibrary-submittable.com/submit](http://xtexasstatelibrary-submittable.com/submit)) is open. The deadline is 6 p.m., Monday, Jan. 26, 2026.


Applications are accepted only through the portal. Students younger than age 13 must also submit a signed permission form in order to enter the contest.
