Dayton Rotarians welcome FLB employees for informative presentation

DAYTON - The Dayton Rotary Club held its weekly meeting, which was well-attended with five guests present. President Dr. Luke Chachere welcomed everyone and invited Dr. Travis Young to offer the opening prayer. Rachel Ansley led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Rotarian John Gable facilitated the program, introducing two employees from First Liberty Bank (FLB), Tyler Jackson, Vice President of Commercial Lending, and Keisha Robinson, Branch Manager, who delivered an informative presentation.

Robinson began with an overview of FLB's history. She shared that First Liberty Bank has been serving Liberty and the surrounding communities since 1913. The bank was estab-

lished by Bert G. Riviere. Today, FLB has expanded to 15 branches.

ject was FLB's utilization of 21 Interactive Teller Machines (ITMs).

The session concluded after extensive discussion and questions directed to the FLB staff members.

President Dr. Chachere provided the club with some reminders, notably regarding the upcoming 100th Anniversary celebration. He then adjourned the meeting with everyone reciting the 4-Way Test.
