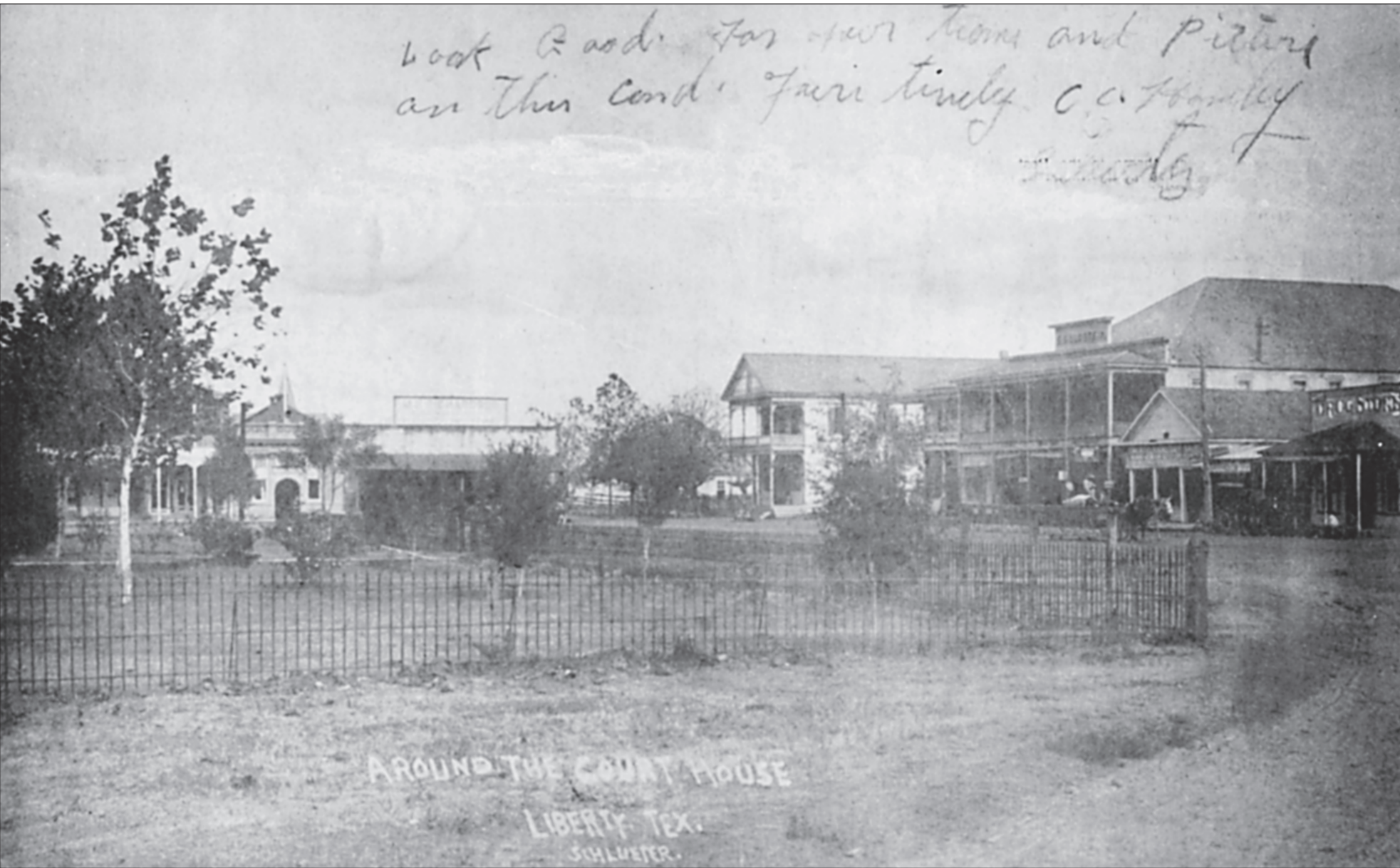
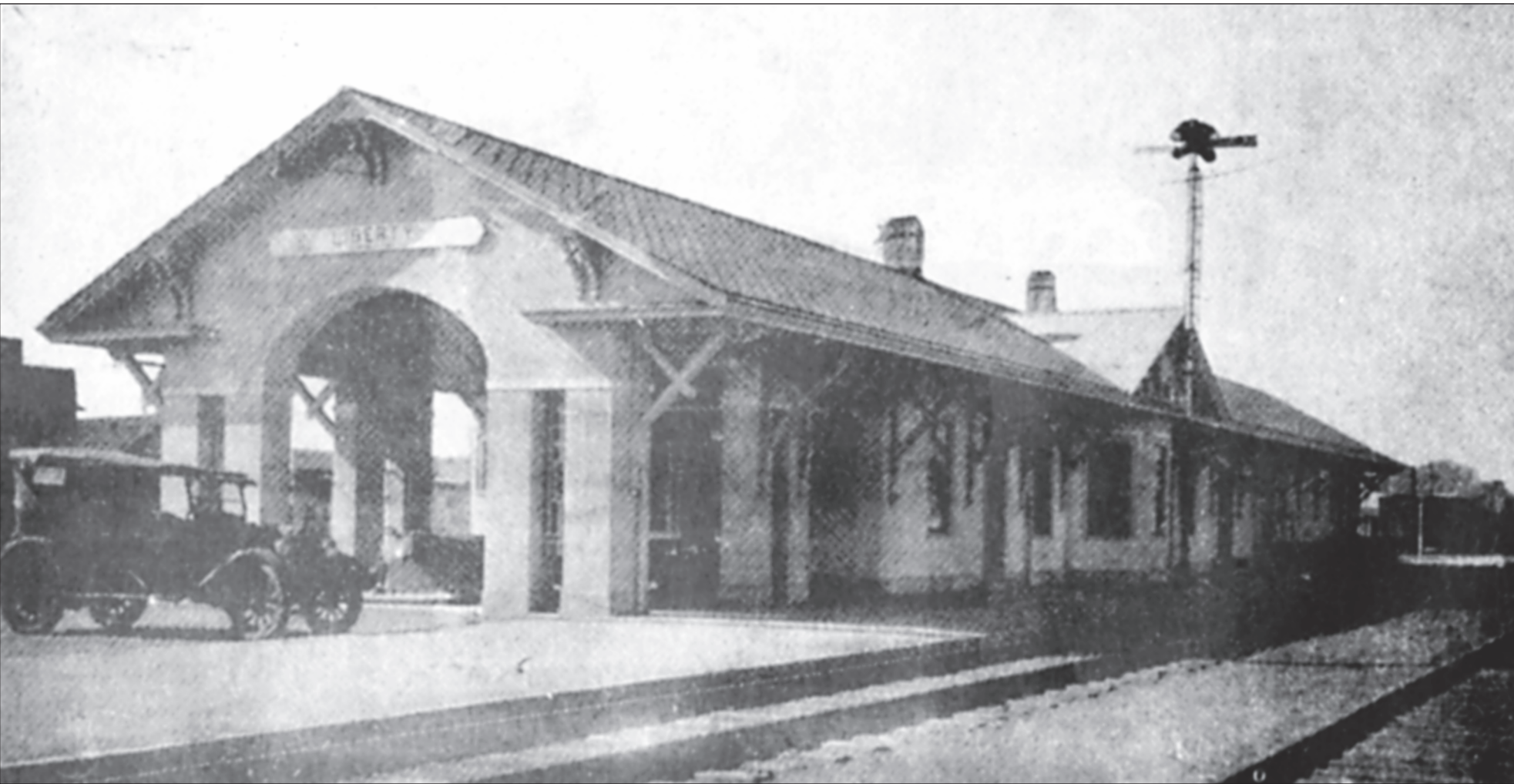

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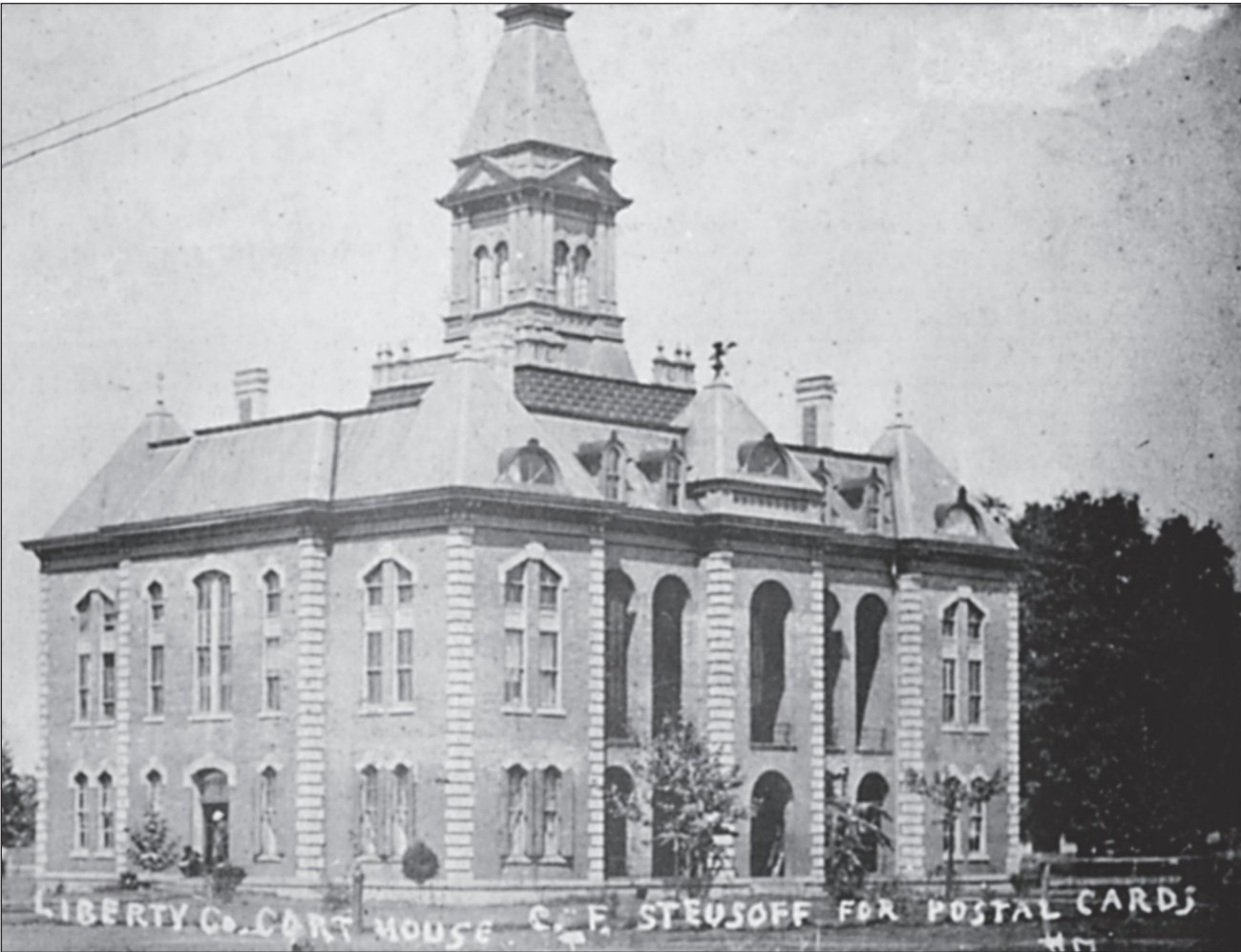

This building was torn down to make way for the present courthouse, which was built in 1930. A previous courthouse burned in the 1890s. Attorney Charles Fisher Jr., Liberty’s most knowledgeable historian, believes that there have been a total of six courthouse buildings, including a hard-to-trace log building before 1850.
