
Houston Methodist Baytown: Seven signs it's time to see a gastroenterologist

bly told you to see a gastroenterologist or a GI doctor. Dr. Kashif Khan, a gastroen-KHAN terologist at Hous-Methodist Baytown Hospital who treats digestive disorders, liver diseases and

several other conditions, ex-

plains everything you need to know if you're deciding

whether it's time to see one. A gastroenterologist is a specialist with expertise in the disorders and diseases that affect the digestive system, which includes the gastrointestinal tract (esophagus, stomach, small intestine, large intestine, rectum and anus) as well as the pancreas, liver, bile ducts and gallbladder.

The digestive disorders and issues that a gastroenterologist treats include: unexplained changes in bowel habits, including diarrhea, constipation and blood in the stool; gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD); heartburn; hemorrhoids; inflammatory bowel disease (IBD), which includes Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis; irritable bowel syndrome (IBS); pancreatitis and ulcers. Gastroenterologists are trained to perform a number of procedures used to help diagnose and treat these conditions.

Here are seven reasons to consider seeing a gastroenterologist:

• Ongoing diarrhea: From food to infection to certain medications, many things can bring on a bout of diarrhea. However, if your stool is regularly more of gallstones, pancreatitis or terologist can recommend more liquid than solid, it's time to check in with a GI doctor.

• Constipation: The frequency of bowel movements ultimately varies from person to person, but Khan says that less than three a week is typically considered constipation. You might also be constipated if your bowel movements are very small, very hard or difficult to pass. If you're constipated more weeks than not, consult a gastroenterologist.

• Frequent or severe heartburn: If you're having heartburn symptoms more than a couple of times per week, it could be a sign of GERD - a condition that, over time, can damage and scar the lining of the esophagus. Chronic acid reflux doesn't go away on its own, so it's important to be evaluated by a specialist. Left untreated, GERD can cause permanent

damage to the esophagus. • Feeling unusually bloated: Bloating, which can feel like your belly is full or tight, is often caused by issues that result in excess gas production, hypersensitivity to gas or gas being trapped in your colon. But bloating can also be a sign of IBS. A gastroenterologist can help you identify what exactly is the cause of your bloating and the most effective way to

• Sudden or severe abdominal pain: We've all dealt with bellyaches, but severe abdominal pain that lasts for hours or abdominal pain that comes on suddenly and intensely isn't normal. A stomach ulcer or peptic ulcer can lead to burning abdominal pain, particularly after eating. Consistently severe abdominal pain can also be a sign liver disease. A gastroenterologist can help determine the cause of your pain.

 Rectal bleeding or blood in your stool: If you see blood on your toilet paper or as you flush the toilet, it could be hemorrhoids – a fairly common issue that can typically be managed with at-home remedies or overthe-counter products. However, if hemorrhoids aren't responding to these treatments or you're getting them frequently, a gastroen-

advanced treatments. Rectal bleeding isn't always a huge concern, but it can be a sign of a serious medical condition such as colorectal cancer.

• You're due for a colonoscopy: If you're over the age of 45 or have a strong family history of colorectal cancer, you've probably heard your doctor recommend a colonoscopy. If the findings are normal and you have no other risk factors, you need to repeat a colonoscopy every 10 years. A colonoscopy can save your life. Early detection of colorectal cancer is important - when caught early, it can lead to less aggressive treatment and better chance of survival.

At your first appointment, your gastroenterologist will ask you about your digestive symptoms and medical history, recommend any lifestyle changes or medications that can help relieve your symptoms and discuss any tests, screenings or

procedures that may be needed. Through this initial evaluation, your doctor will start the process of uncovering the cause of your digestive issues and begin addressing your symptoms.



On October 29, 2025, Entergy Texas, Inc. ("ETI") filed an application for approval to amend its

Transmission Cost Recovery Factor ("TCRF") with the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission" or "PUC"). The application was assigned PUC Docket No. 58889. The proposed TCRF is requested in accordance with the Public Utility Regulatory Act § 36.209 and 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 25.239. A TCRF allows a utility to recover its reasonable and necessary costs that have occurred since the end of the test year in the utility's last base rate case for transmission

infrastructure improvement and changes in wholesale transmission charges to the electric utility under a tariff approved by a federal regulatory authority. In its requested amendment, ETI is seeking recovery of costs for transmission capital investments it incurred from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025. ETI also seeks to recover approved transmission charges that are not otherwise being recovered through rates. The proposed TCRF as amended would result in total TCRF retail revenues of approximately

fuel costs as compared to such revenues. The impact of the rate change on various customer classes will vary from the overall impact described in this notice. The effective date of the proposed rate change would be the date that a Commission order adopting the proposed TCRF is issued. ETI has requested that, if no hearing is requested, the Commission adopt an order approving the proposed TCRF at or before its currently scheduled open meeting on January 15, 2026. All customers in ETI's Texas retail rate classes are affected

by this request.

The deadline for intervention in the proceeding is 45 days after the date the application was

filed with the Commission. Therefore, ETI has requested that the deadline be December 15, 2025, and a letter requesting intervention should be received by the Commission by that date.
